

## SEMINAR: HOW TO GET PUBLISHED

The four Graduate Schools at Aarhus University are hosting a joint seminar with the theme: *How to get published*. The seminar will bring together PhD students, researchers, editors and higher education professionals for a day of presentations and discussions.
