The event is for international PhD students, postdoctoral scholars, associate professors and other newly arrived staff. Guest researchers and guest PhD-students residing in Denmark for more than 3 months are also welcome. Your partner/spouse and children are also very welcome to attend but may not get registered at the event. Each participant must sign-up individually.
